One-story, gabled dwelling of log and frame. Metal roof; gable end of log section is covered in horizontal wood siding. Fireplace chimney on west elevation is concrete covered in stone facing. Original section is of squared log; it contains an off-center entrance with newer paneled and glazed door. Gabled, frame additions on north and east are clad in horizontal wood siding. Shed-roofed addition on rear. Windows are newer multilite windows. Concrete foundation.

Construction history (major additions, alterations, demolitions): The log cabin was expanded with a frame addition and clapboards were applied to the exterior, including the log section, circa 1880. Cross-gabled addition built on the west circa 1965. The dwelling underwent restoration in 1998, which removed clapboards that had been applied circa 1800. The fireplace chimney was added on the west elevation, circa 2000. 30. Original location: X Moved Date of move(s) V. Historical Associations 31. Original use(s): Cabin 32. Historical background: Lake City's first marriage occurred May 9, 1876, when Davey Hughes, a compositor on the SILVER WORLD newspaper, married Miss Kitty Eastman. Townspeople immediately pitched in to construct this log cabin as a wedding gift to the couple, located on Third Street on the eastern end of Lots 17 and 18, Block 56, owned by the bridegroom. The newlyweds lived in the cabin for only a few months before selling the property to C.L. Peyton, a founding member of the SILVER WORLD. Peyton in turn sold the cabin to attorney John C. Bell in 1879; Bell covered the log cabin with clapboards. added an addition and opened it as his law office and residence. It served solely as his law office after he moved his family to the next door property, the Bell-Soderholm House, 300 Bluff, in 1882. Bell sold the cabin to local miner Bill Hardy in 1925 and it was acquired by E.W. Soderholm as a rental in 1939. Later owners of the home added an exterior layer of stucco to the cabin which, with the earlier clapboards, was removed in 2000 to reveal the original Hughes log cabin. The cabin, together with a frame addition to the west dating from the mid-1960s, is today used as offices for Hinsdale County Human Services. Sources of information:



	This dwelling reflects settlement and development of Lake City during the late 1800s mining era. The original portion of the building typifies the Pioneer Log buildings constructed during Lake City's late 1870s settlement period. Like many others it was covered in clapboards soon after original construction.
43.	Assessment of historic physical integrity to significance:
	Although somewhat altered by the circa 1965 frame addition, this dwelling retains its architectural integrity through the squared-log construction, original openings, and original roof form.
