Amos C. "Crit" Hart (1848-1914), a Lake City miner who later lived in Telluride, Montrose, and Idaho Springs, Colorado, lived in this single story adobe house in 1880. He sold the home to John Mignolet for \$700 in 1882. Mignolet served as Belgian Consul for Colorado and the mountain states, and was noted for his musical abilities. He left Lake City to engage in the banking business in Denver, although he continued ownership of this Lot 32, Block 42, house until the early 1920s. Subsequent owners were Carl Jensen and Margaret Mendenhall Dunn, prior to acquisition by Ruth Peniston Vernon for use as a rental. It is now owned by Norma Grantham.

The original adobe house was covered with board and battens in the 1950s. Associated outbuildings include a frame garage and shed and historic squared-log cabin, adjacent to the alley, with double doors opening into the alley. The exact purpose of the circa 1880 building is unknown, although it may have been a workshop or stable used in conjunction with the H.A. Avery House, 425 Silver Street. The roof of the cabin was collapsed in the early 1980s but subsequently restored by the Granthams and used as a storage building at present.

A nearly identical neighboring house, the Smith-Grantham House, was located on Lot 31, Block 42, but was moved in 1982 and is today a house museum at Hinsdale County Museum, 124 Silver Street.



	This house is associated with settlement and development of Lake City during the late 1800s mining era. It is a slightly altered representative of the vernacular dwellings constructed in Lake City during this period, as reflected in its simple design, board and batten exterior, gabled roof, 2-over-2 double hung windows, and lack of architectural details that indicate a particular style. Application of different exterior materials and the construction of a bathroom addition are typical alterations received by many Lake City houses, reflecting how owners adapted to changing needs.
	The two sheds located at the rear of the lot near the alley are also associated with settlement and development of Lake City. They are representative of the outbuildings constructed in Lake City in the late 1800s and early 1900s as reflected in their alley location, log and frame construction and wood siding.
43.	Assessment of historic physical integrity to significance:
	The architectural integrity of this dwelling is intact, as evidenced by minimal alterations to its character-defining features. Although board and batten siding has been applied over the adobe walls, the roof form, size, scale and window and door openings remain intact. The outbuildings retain a high level of architectural integrity.
