Historical background: This site -- located on Lot One of the 11-parcel West Lake Addition, an 1884 addition to the Town of Lake City -- is associated with Charles Hammond Bent (1838-1896) who represented Hinsdale County in the state legislature in the early 1890s. He mined and prospected in the area starting in 1875 and is recalled in present-day Bent Peak and Bent Creek on the upper Lake Fork. He constructed a 1-1/2-story frame house at this location in 1882. It was owned by Mrs. George C. Stephen at the time it burned to the ground in 1918. The surviving structure is what is known as the "mule barn," a gabled frame stable which is located


