625 Gunnison is a side-gable cabin with front-facing gable porch which was built c. 1954 as part of Lee's Log Cabins resort operated by Sid and Edna Lee. It dates from a second phase of construction at the resort and is contemporary with its neighbors, 627 Gunnison and 629 Gunnison, together with a nolonger-extant cabin to the immediate south which was moved off the property in 1986. It continued as a rental as part of San Cristobal Cabins until 1979 when it and other cabins were sold to individual owners.
